For many years the Tread of Pioneers Museum has realized that the old collections building was overcrowded, lacked needed environmental controls, and was unsafe for the collection and staff. The tiny building was not sufficient to serve our community's treasures for the future. After many years of analysis by the staff and Board of Directors, working with architects, city planning, and city council, and fundraising, the museum has embarked on the much needed expansion project.

Construction of the new collection facility and exhibit space began on May 1 with estimated completion by the end of this year. The new building will add much needed exhibit space that will allow the story and heritage of Steamboat Springs to be told in greater detail. The new collection facility area will provide museum quality storage and curatorial work space to care for the many historical artifacts that are in the collection now and for those artifacts that will be added in years to come. The new facility has been designed with adequate space to serve the community for the next 30 years. History is made every day, and this facility will allow the museum to preserve our history for future generations.

The financial ability to build this new facility was made possible by generous gifts from the Gloria Gossard Estate and the Crawford family, donations of all sizes from many community members, and grants from various foundations. We are thrilled to announce that we received significant grant funding from the Gates Family Foundation, Boettcher Foundation, and the El Pomar Foundation, as well as the Routt County Museum and Heritage Fund. The museum's Board of Directors and staff would like to thank everyone who assisted in the planning of this project over many years and to the community members who gave so generously to this project.
